Florists won't be the only Valentine's Day hotspots. Lingerie shops across the city figure to be crowded.

"(Today) will be quite insane. It's almost like Christmas ... thank goodness I have it off," said Georgina Hillman of La Senza in the Cornwall Centre

Hillman, who said the store's new "Love" line of apparel is a hot seller, noted the store had a really busy past weekend with early Valentine's Day shoppers. Hillman said a large number of the store's annual Feb. 14 shoppers are rarely punctual.

Several Reginans met their potential Valentines on Wednesday. Cupid.com held a speed-dating event attended by 21 Regina singles.

Tracy Lewgood, Cupid.com event co-ordinator, said the evening was fun.

"The event went really well. It was only the fourth for Cupid.com in Regina," she said.

Ten women had 10 six-minute dates with 11 men. At the conclusion of the evening, Lewgood collected match sheets from each single. She tabulated the results and notified the daters who had received a match.
